



Dear Supporter,

Well in excess of 300 supporters have expressed outrage and written to Hilary McGrady, Director-General of the National Trust, following [our article](#) last month about the Trust's critical support for widening the A303 with a short tunnel near Stonehenge. Although the scheme avoids land owned by the Trust, you might remember that their land holding at Stonehenge included land that had been entrusted to it since the 1920s following a high profile national appeal.

Some replies by the Director-General have been forwarded to us. These reiterated the Trust's stance on the A303 scheme, dismissing people's profound anxieties. They also contained such misunderstandings that we sent them to the proposers who led the A303 Stonehenge Resolution at last year's AGM for urgent action.

The five proposers have written to the Trust's Chairman and Trustees listing serious misapprehensions and numerous points that needed correction.
