Mike Parker Pearson is Professor of British Later Prehistory at the Institute of Archaeology, UCL. He was director of the Stonehenge Riverside Project that worked to situate Stonehenge within the archaeology of the surrounding landscape, and his idea that the bluestones came from a dismantled Neolithic stone circle in Pembrokeshire which recently made headlines around the world.



Phil Goodwin is Emeritus Professor and Senior Fellow of Transport Policy at UCL and the University of the West of England. Phil has served as transport economist at the Greater London Council, the director of the Transport Studies Unit at Oxford University, and is an advisor to the Department of Transport. He is a noted authority on travel demand, transport policy and climate change.

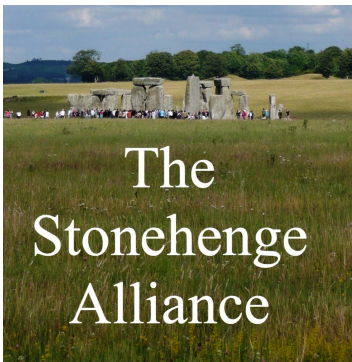


Our president, Tom Holland is an award-winning historian and broadcaster. His most recent book is *Dominion: The Making of the Western Mind*.
