The time is right, nearly 10 years on, to hand in our historic International Petition tomorrow afternoon. The international petition was launched on line nearly ten years ago in December, 2014. We then tried out our first banner and leaflet in January 2015 at a Friends of the Earth demo in Parliament Square (archive mages below).

We have since gathered more than **239,500 signatures from 147 countries** to hand over to the Secretary of State for Transport and Secretary of State for Culture, Media and Sport tomorrow. A third minister will also be handed a letter at the Department for Transport with a new job title: Future of Roads Minister.

<u>ABOUT THE STONEHENGE ALLIANCE</u>



The Stonehenge Alliance was set up in 2002 to protect the Stonehenge World Heritage Site from further damage. It has campaigned against the current road scheme since its inception in 2014. It is appalled by the Government's decision to go ahead with the short tunnel and road widening project in the face of:

- strong advice from its Planning Inspectorate not to proceed,
- UNESCO's World Heritage Committee's condemnation, and
- the High Court's quashing of the scheme in 2021.
- Next stop: the Court of Appeal!

The Stonehenge Alliance is run by a small team of volunteers and supported by Ancient Sacred Landscape Network; Campaign to Protect Rural England; Friends of the Earth; Rescue, The British Archaeological Trust; Transport Action Network and many individuals worldwide.
