We have been inundated with messages of shared relief that the road proposal has been cancelled including UNESCO which had just gone through a bruising experience in Delhi. The Director General, Audrey Azoulay, posted this: " @UNESCO welcomes the Starmer government's decision to cancel the construction of a road tunnel under the #Stonehenge World Heritage Site.

UNESCO stands ready to support the UK authorities in reconciling the needs of development and conservation of this outstanding heritage. "

On the other hand, Wiltshire Council lost no time to lobby against the decision: 'Wiltshire Council leader frustrated at A303 tunnel cancellation' - repeated on BBC's World Tonight. Richard Clewar's reaction was promptly ridiculed by a Wiltshire blogger 'Wiltshire Council leader weeps over the scrapping of the Stonehenge tunnel!' (worth a read).

SO IT'S NOT QUITE OVER

The scheme has only been cancelled due to a lack of cash. Its planning permission (the Development Consent Order) remains intact, and if the government suddenly found the money it could go ahead and build it. That's why we can't rest easy until the permission is quashed.

While the Court of Appeal has yet to consider the legality of the decision to approve the scheme (with a judgment expected in the autumn), the government could save us all a lot of time and effort and reverse the decision now. In the meantime, the World Heritage Site's future is still at risk.

So, don't go! We will be in touch again in due course.

ABOUT THE STONEHENGE ALLIANCE



The Stonehenge Alliance was set up in 2002 to protect the Stonehenge World Heritage Site from further damage. It has campaigned against the current road scheme since its inception in 2014. It is appalled by the Government's decision to go ahead with the short tunnel and road widening project in the face of:

- strong advice from its Planning Inspectorate not to proceed,
- UNESCO's World Heritage Committee's condemnation, and
- the High Court's quashing of the scheme in 2021.

The Labour Government cancelled the scheme on 29 July 2024 on grounds of "low value and unaffordable commitment". We await the decision of the Court of Appeal expected this autumn.
